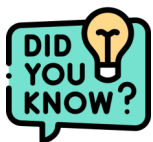
**We ask that all Ticket Packages be returned as soon as possible, but not later than December 3. The tickets must be tabulated before the Draw on Dec. 10.**

## Archbishop's Appeal

Today is the solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Christ the King will restore all creation and restore his kingdom to the Father. The risen people of God will rejoice in a new heaven and a new earth. In 2020, Pope Francis also declared this day World Day of Youth. Saint John Paul the Great had this to say to young people: "It is Jesus you seek when you dream of happiness; he is waiting for you when nothing else you find satisfies you; he is the beauty to which you are so attracted; it is he who provokes you with that thirst for fullness that will not let you settle for compromise; it is he who urges you to shed the masks of a false life; it is he who reads in your hearts your most genuine choices, the choices that others try to stifle. It is Jesus who stirs in you the desire to do something great with your lives, the will to follow an ideal, the refusal to allow yourselves to be grounded down by mediocrity, the courage to commit yourselves humbly and patiently to improving yourselves and society, making the world more human and more fraternal."
