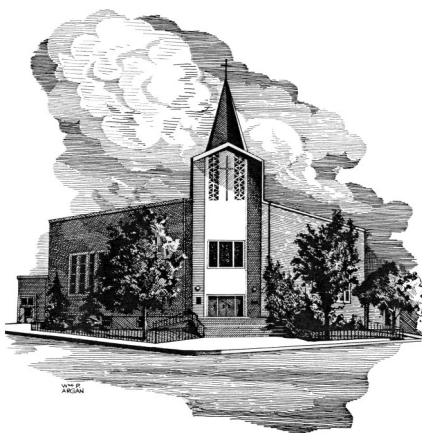

Offering of the Mass

By virtue of the "communion of saints," the Church commends the dead to God's mercy and offers her prayers especially the holy sacrifice of the Eucharist, on their behalf. (Catechism of the Catholic Church). This practice dates as far back as Judas collecting a sin-offering for the dead, making an atonement so that they might be delivered from their sin. (2 Maccabees 12:39-45). Masses may also be offered for the intentions of the living or in thanksgiving. Masses may be requested through the parish office.

If you wish to have the Mass offered on a specific date, please make arrangements at least one month in advance.

Calling all young people!

The Archdiocese of Regina Leadership Camp will not be able to run as usual this year. But, in its place we are running four day camps out at Glen Harbour. Two of the days (Aug. 23 & 25) are open to those entering grades 7-9 in the Fall. And two of the days (August 24 & 26) will be dedicated to those entering grades 10 – first year university in the Fall. Students may register for one or both of the days for their age group. The themes for the days are: “Mysteries, Miracles and Marvels” & “Who Dunit?” Both days will be filled with fun, faith and fellowship while following appropriate health guidelines.
