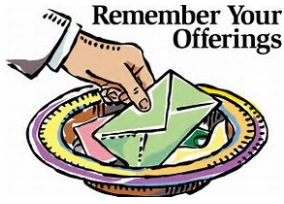

(Catechism of the Catholic Church). This practice dates as far back as Judas collecting a sin-offering for the dead, making an atonement so that they might be delivered from their sin. (2 Maccabees 12:39-45). Masses may also be offered for the intentions of the living or in thanksgiving. Masses may be requested through the parish office.

“As One Who Serves”

Ever wonder what kinds of diaconal ministry are done by the deacons in our Archdiocese? As we learned a few weeks ago, diaconal ministry is very flexible. Any need in the community, particularly with the marginalized and generally outside the four walls of the Church building, that lines up with a particular deacon's talents, experience, and sense of call can be considered. In the Archdiocese of Regina deacons serve in healthcare contexts, visiting the elderly and infirm, in First Nations communities, in Friends on the Outside, helping former inmates reintegrate with society, working with Catholic Family Services, or working with our Archdiocesan youth camps. One of the great blessings of the diaconate has been the possibility of putting experience and expertise gained in the world of secular education and employment to work for the Church.
