





Stewardship Bulletin Bit June 19, 2022 **Body and Blood of Christ**



"They all ate and were satisfied. And when the leftover fragments were picked up, they filled twelve wicker baskets.'

Luke 9:17

The story of the Loaves and Fishes shows us that when you share what you have, even if it doesn't seem like that much, miracles can happen! Do not think that your gift is too small or insignificant! Each of us has a role in God's plan; you just need to place your trust in the Lord. Nothing is impossible with God. You may be the answer to someone else's prayer.

The God Who Takes Us Up



If you are a parent, you know the joy that comes when a child needs our help. They run into our arms with a problem or with tears because of an injury. We long and

love to help them. But when we need comfort, do we always go to our heavenly Father? Or do we seek other means of consolation?

Psalm 68:5 says, He is "a father to the fatherless." 1 John 3:1 says, "See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God!" He has not only identified Himself as our Father, but He tells us how He acts as our Father.

First of all and most importantly, He saves us. "For God so loved the world, that he gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life." He pays attention to us. "The eye of the Lord runs to and fro throughout the whole earth searching to help someone whose heart is completely His." (2 Chronicles 16:9). In Psalm 94:19, It reassures us that, "When my anxious thoughts multiply within me, Your consolations delight my soul." What is National Indigenous Peoples Day (NIPD)?



June 21 is National Indigenous Peoples Day. This is a day for all Canadians to recognize and celebrate the unique heritage, diverse cultures and outstanding contributions of First Nations, Inuit and

Métis peoples. The Canadian Constitution recognizes these three groups as Aboriginal peoples, also known as Indigenous peoples. Although these groups share many similarities, they each have their own distinct heritage, language, cultural practices and spiritual beliefs. In cooperation with Indigenous organizations, the Government of Canada chose June 21, the summer solstice, for National Aboriginal Day, now known as National Indigenous Peoples Day. For generations, many Indigenous peoples and communities have celebrated their culture and heritage on or near this day due to the significance of the summer solstice as the longest day of the year.
