Stewardship Bulletin Bit March 6, 2022 **1st Sunday of Lent**



"I have now brought you the first fruits of the products of the soil which you, O Lord, have given to me."

Deuteronomy 6:10

This line from the Old Testament offers two challenges. First, do you give to God from your "first fruits" - the first and best that you have to offer, or do you give from what you have leftover? Second, do you realize that everything you have and that everything you are has been given to you by God? Ask God for a grateful and generous heart, every day, in all circumstances.

Jesus' Temptation



"Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness, where for forty days he was tempted by the devil. He ate nothing

at all during those days, and when they were over, he was famished. "

Luke 4:1 - 4

The story of Jesus' temptation in the desert echoes the Israelites 40 years of wandering in the desert. God had led them out of slavery in Egypt, and they were on their way to the Promised Land, but the journey ended up being much longer and harder than they had imagined. They were famished a lot those years. Sometimes they were literally in danger of starving or dying of dehydration until God fed them with manna and gave them water from a rock.
