

Offering of the Mass

By virtue of the “communion of saints,” the Church commends the dead to God’s mercy and offers her prayers especially the holy sacrifice of the Eucharist, on their behalf. (Catechism of the Catholic Church). This practice dates as far back as Judas collecting a sin-offering for the dead, making atonement so they might be delivered from their sin. (2 Maccabees 12:39-45). Masses may also be offered for the intentions of the living or in thanksgiving. Masses are requested through the parish office. 



Three Nakota (Assiniboine) leaders Man Who Takes The Coat, Long Lodge, and Lean Man signed an adhesion to Treaty 4 at Fort Walsh on September 25, 1877.
