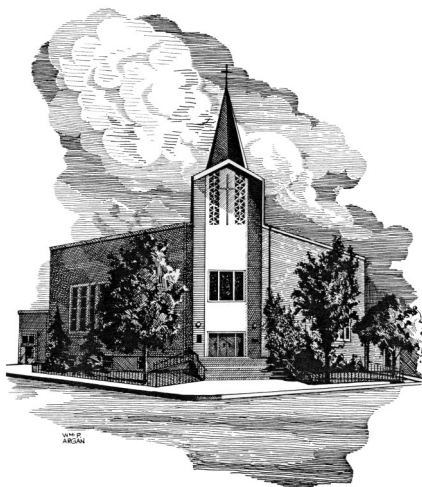

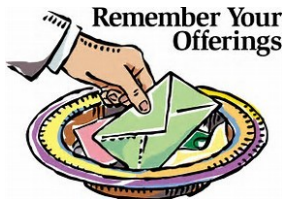
Also, please let your parish know if you are entering the hospital.
